
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PUBLIC CONSULTATION

CO-HOUSING FOR LOCAL PEOPLE

Tuesday 22nd January 2013 at Much Birch Village Hall

After years of dreaming, a group of local people are unfolding a community led development in partnership with Herefordshire Housing, on a field adjacent to the existing estate on Tump Lane in Much Birch.

"An intentional co-housing community for people of all ages and all walks of life to come together for mutual support and for utilising our shared resources."

- The project will deliver a mix of house types for social rent and market sale, comprising approximately 20 homes.
- The land will offer a safe environment for children to play in and facilitate the cultivation of a community garden to grow vegetables and plant fruit trees.
- The community house will accommodate regular shared meals, meetings, social events, guest rooms, laundry facilities and work space.

We are living in a world that is changing rapidly, both in good ways and in ways that seem beyond our control. Co-housing will enable us to share our opportunities and challenges with an intentional support network.

Cohousing communities are intentional communities created and run by their residents. Although each household has a self-contained home, residents will regularly come together to manage their community, sharing social activities as well as responsibilities.
