Neighbourhood Development Planning

Are you interested in how the area should be developed in future?

The Localism Act 2011 that came into force in 2012 gave parishes the right to prepare a neighbourhood development plan

A neighbourhood development plan can establish general planning policies for the development and use of land in a neighbourhood, like:

- where new homes and offices should be built
- what they should look like

The plan can be detailed or general, depending what local people want.

Neighbourhood plans allow local people to get the right type of development for their community.

PARISH MEETING – at the Annual Parish Meeting held on the 2nd May 2013, at the Much Birch Community Hall. The first part of the meeting was the Annual Parish Meeting at which parishioners were invited to talk to the Council and a resume was supplied re the previous year's activities. A new Clerk had been welcomed and also two new councillors. There had been updates from West Mercia Policing and the Ward Councillor, Russell Hamilton. Also contributions about local issues from parishioners, for which the Parish Council are always grateful, as it is when feedback is given that actions can be taken to get things done. The Self Help Gritting Scheme had come good and the combined efforts had kept the locality on the move when the weather did its worst. There was some concern expressed over fast and heavy goods traffic in Tump Lane and this included the safety of pedestrians on the way to and from school, and at other times. This will be an agenda item for the meeting in June and this will include the possibility of looking into a request for a weight restriction on the road.

The Annual meeting of the Parish Council then followed with the election of Chair, Cllr Alison Cook and Vice Chair, Cllr Steve Turner, plus Footpath Officer, Cllr Andrew Crum. There was a brief report from Cllr Hamilton which will be followed by publication of his full bulletin. Councillors were then appointed to the relevant working groups, such as planning, and the business of the Parish Council continued.
