Incidents within South of Hereford - Urban

In March 2017 there were 491 incidents reported from the South of Hereford to West Mercia Police. These reports were attended and dealt with by either your SNT or by response officers.

75 of these incidents were "Grade 1", which means 999 was dialled in an emergency; an incident that is either life threatening or a crime is in progress.

Of these incidents, 97 crimes were recorded. These crimes relate to; 23 Thefts, 16 Assaults, 9 Damage, 5 Burglaries and 44 Misc.

Incidents of note

Rogers Avenue

OIS 0914S 240317 – Two males were seen damaging cars and properties along Rogers Avenue. Both males were shortly arrested by response officers. Thanks to the member of the public that called us and to the swift work from our response team.

Honddu Close

OIS 0387S 030317 – A garage was broken into, luckily nothing of value was stolen. Remember to keep your garages secure and valuable items should be property marked and locked away.

Merryhill Crescent

18/03/17 – A number of calls were made to police on the 18th March in relation to a group of youths causing issues to residents of Merryhill Crescent. If you are concerned about Cold Callers coming to your door, cut out the below sign and display it in your window or on your front door. Any legitimate door knocker will abide by this sign and should leave you alone. If you have concerns about Cold Callers in your area, please call 101.



Incidents within South of Hereford - Rural

In **March** there were **123** incidents reported from rural areas in the South of Hereford to West Mercia Police. These reports were attended and dealt with by either your SNT or by response officers.

15 of these incidents were "Grade 1", which means 999 was dialled in an emergency; an incident that is either life threatening or a crime is in progress.

Of these incidents, 19 crimes were recorded. These crimes relate to; 6 Thefts, 5 Assaults, 1 Damage, 1 Burglary and 6 Misc.

Items of note

Much Birch

OIS 0374S 010317 – A large quantity of heating oil was stolen from a home in Much Birch. Reminder to people with external heating oil tanks, please keep them as secure as you possibly can, and check your levels frequently. Report any suspicious activity in your area on 101.

Kilpeck

OIS 0334S 230317 – Two dogs were report stolen from an address in Kilpeck. The owner was distraught, however the dogs were later found locally.

Callow
