Local News for June 2018.



FREEMAN OF CHESTER

Last month Aconbury resident, Jennifer Jones, became a 'Freeman of Chester' – that's right, FreeMAN, not WOMAN. Her father and his two brothers were made 'Free' in 1979 by right of birth but daughters were not eligible, as it was passed down from father to son. The Jones brothers only had daughters so it was thought, then, that the family link would die out but in 1993 the Guilds decided to admit women for the first time. The Jones cousins decided to continue this link with history by also applying to be made 'Free'.

Chester's Lord Mayor, who is a woman, officiated at the ceremony, in all her splendid regalia, supported by the Mace Bearer and Sword Bearer – and a host of existing Freemen in Blue Gowns and Ceremonial Hats. There were 22 applicants in total and each had to swear an oath "to be faithful, profitable and true to the Queen of Great Britain and the Commonalty of the City of Chester".

Asked why she wanted to become a Freeman, Jennifer said that it was to honour her father and support the Guilds and she was thrilled to be given the opportunity. When asked if it conveyed any privileges she said if she were a military man she could march her militia through the city with fixed bayonets!

Her Great Great Grandfather was the first Jones to be granted the Freedom of the City after serving a seven year apprenticeship as a linen draper. Jennifer has now joined the Cappers, Pinners, Wierdrawers and Linnendrapers(sic) Guild.

Little Birch & Aconbury Joint Neighbourhood Development Plan

Draft Plan

At a meeting of the Steering Group on 16 May our consultant Dr. David Nicholson drew attention to the **responses to our Consultation Draft Plan**. There were replies from various departments of Herefordshire Council and various other authorities. These were The Coal Authority, Environment Agency, Highways England, Natural England, Welsh Water and Woodland Trust – and 17 responses, many of which were appreciated, from residents of Aconbury and Little Birch using the **Reponse Forms** supplied with the copy of the **Consultation Draft** given to all households in the two parishes.

This has resulted in a small number of amendments to the Plan, which were discussed at the meeting and approved by the Steering Group. The revised version of the NDP is now being prepared by David and will be returned to Herefordshire Council for another round of environmental assessments. When finalised this will be returned to Little Birch Parish Council and Aconbury Parish Meeting for approval.

Fundraising for Much Birch Church

The Fundraising Committee for Much Birch Church has been working hard to raise the necessary funds required for the repair and restoration of windows in Much Birch Church at a total cost of around £36,198. So far, 4 windows on the south wall and some stonework around them have been repaired to the tune of £18,697.56. This was achieved by small grants and kind donations, as well as fundraising events organised by the committee and supported by the community. We now need to repair and restore the East Stained Glass window, which has been in place since about 1850 and has had no repair work carried out since then. We want to preserve this beautiful window; so to prevent further bowing of the panes and damage to the lead work, it needs to be specialist repaired in the very near future. The estimated cost of this part of the project is £17,500 and so far the total sum raised for this phase is £10,440. Again this has been achieved by kind and generous donations from one or two people as well as further fundraising events. We need help now to achieve our objective! We are therefore appealing to members of the community to support us, either by joining our Fundraising Committee, or putting forward ideas on how to raise the rest of the money needed, by fundraising themselves, or by simply donating.

The Fundraising Committee not only raises funds for the Windows project but also contributes to the general running of the church e.g. by the cake stall and refreshments at the Village Market, and therefore intends to continue its existence after the window project is complete. The present members have worked very hard over the last 2 years but would very much welcome new members to share the load. You would be met with open arms! There is a very colourful chart located in the church, based on a picture of the stained glass window, the idea of, and cleverly put together by Dr. Peter Garlick, which indicates the progress of the fund raising. Not the Archers....but the Masons at Merrivale

Having been on the various village walks recently, people have been wanting to know what we have been up to on the farm so I thought I'd set about explaining some of this.

As a quick introduction, Merrivale Farm is a 400 acre organic dairy farm. Bob and myself (Sue) took on the tenancy at Merrivale in 1981 and moved with our children and 60 cows from Staffordshire. We now have around 180 milking cows and 180 youngstock of various ages that provide us with our replacements for the herd. The farm is now run by our son Ben and daughter Lucy with two other employees. Bob and myself, reluctant to retire, still turn up and annoy everyone and do various jobs....because there is always something to do. One thing I can be certain of over the years is that if you cross one job off the list two more are added.

The farm belongs to the Duchy of Cornwall's Hereford Estate. We did have a visit from our Landlord, Prince Charles in 2000 when the Duchy purchased the estate from Prudential Insurance.

So what have we been up to lately? After a grim, dark & wet winter, spring at last arrived and it was finally dry enough for the cows to go out to graze in mid April. Since then, we have steadily been putting all the younger cattle out to grass in various groups. The groups consist of close to calving, far off calving and then younger cattle that are not yet ready to be put in calf. Two weeks ago we cut 200 acres of grass and made it into silage, ready for next winter. Crazy that with winter just over we

are already preparing for the next one.

To make silage, the grass is mown, wilted for 24 hours, then picked up and chopped by a forage harvester. The harvester blows the grass into trailers which then tip it into a pit where it is heaped, rolled and finally sheeted to keep out the air. The sugars in the grass then ferment to produce acid down to a pH or around 4 which then preserves the grass.

At the same time we mowed more grass. We baled and wrapped it in plastic – the same process of preservation but in bales rather than loose in a pit. With the grass cut, the ground is then fertilised using farmyard manure and slurry from the cows. This makes the grass grow ready for another cut in 4 to 5 weeks time.

Many people in the village who have visited the farm on one of our various open days, will know that our cows are milked by three Lely Robots. If you haven't seen these and want to see how they work, do an internet search for Lely A4 Astronaut and you will find a video. The nice thing about milking cows through robots is that the cows are more free to roam but tend to put themselves into a routine of being milked every 8 hours.

In the summer the cows go through the robots and are let out to grazing from 9.30pm. When we turn up in the morning all but 3 or 4 have gone out so we send them through to make sure every animal is milked at least twice a day. Everywhere is then cleaned and bedded and we let the cows in again to get milked and go out onto the day grass paddocks.

By 3pm all the cows have gone out again. We then repeat the process of cleaning and bedding everything and at 4pm the cows will start bringing themselves back in. By 6pm all the cows are in and eating a mixed diet of silage and organic concentrates that we feed them on to keep them full while they're in the shed. At 9.30pm the whole process starts again and the cows start to go out on the night time grass paddocks.

We have an opportunity between 8am and 5pm to check any cows that need attention. The computer that controls the robots and takes information from the cows when they are milking will highlight any problems.

So that's an introduction to what we get up to. If there is enough interest, I can do regular update, focussing on a different topic each time. This would mean I can give a more detailed insight into what goes on.

Hope you're enjoying this beautiful weather as much as we are!


