Duchy Walk Wednesday May 8th.

Several wooded areas around Little Birch are part of the Duchy of Cornwall which was set up by Edward 11 in 1337 to provide income for the Duke of Cornwall, Prince of Wales. The woods are managed by the head forester Geraint Richards who is based near to Mevagissy and Ed Clark who works from the office at Dewsall. Prince Charles, the current Duke of Cornwall takes particular interest to the Herefordshire Duchy estates especially woodlands as shown by photographs on the website. In the normal course of events he will be succeeded by Prince William who has already been shown around local woods

In previous years Geraint and his team led walking tours of Aconbury. Wallbrook, Nether and Athelstans woods. The objectives were to keep local people informed about the history of each area, how it is being managed, problems being encountered and explain future plans. This year the walk was around Rough Hill wood, the latest in the area to be acquired by the Duchy and not normally open to the public. It is situated between Athelstans wood and the C1261 Hereford to Hoarwithv road and is approached by a newly constructed entrance near to Caldicot crossroads. Geriant explained that ownership of this wood enabled a new road, about a mile long, to be installed to provide access for heavy lorries and equipment to the larger adjacent Athestans wood that was previously very difficult. The walk proceeded from the entrance in Aconbury parish along the new road and across the stream into Athelstans wood in Little Birch parish and then return to the starting

point. Total distance was about three miles which, with frequent stops for explanations, took two hours. Trees in the wood are almost entirely deciduous broad leaved types including a large number of maturing oaks and some excellent examples of Redwoods, originally from California, planted by a previous owner. As trees are harvested it is intended to replace them exclusively with broad leaved varieties that allow undergrowth and good soil health -unlike evergreen trees that restrict light penetration even in winter. Replanting needs careful consideration of pests and diseases. As an example, the planting of oak is very problematic because of damage caused by grey squirrels. All the existing healthy oak trees were well grown before the upsurge of the grev squirrel population that does not have natural predators. The Duchy is monitoring experiences in other areas where Pine Martens have been introduced to try to control squirrels. To counteract the spread of diseases different types of trees are interspersed. Recent platings include Sweet Chestnut that will likely be cut back soon to encourage coppicing for fencing stakes.

After the walk most participants enjoyed refreshments in the village hall where Geriant and Ed continued to explain aspects of forestry, wild life, working for royalty and answer questions.

Amateur dramatics have been popular in the Village Hall since it opened. It became a tradition to perform a pantomime around Christmas but lapsed when not enough people wanted to continue. After a period of a few years Hilary Gould was persuaded to start again and in 2007 she wrote and produced "Treasure Island", with the help of family, friends and local people. It was a great success and the next year "Snow White" enchanted us! There was no looking back and each year the Group have given us a new panto. Sadly Hilary is no longer with us but won't be forgotten. Other producers have stepped in, notably Jane Bolam, with other productions by the late Paul Bishop, Tim Betts and last year Frank Ryder. All have done an excellent job.

The Group have, in recent years, produced some extremely professional Summer shows – 'Allo 'Allo!, 'Black Adder', 'Cash on Delivery' and last year 'One Man Two Guvnors'. Jennifer Baldwin also produced variety show - bits of which are shown at various functions. Sarah Elliot directed 'One Man, Two Guvnors.

This Summer the Group is having a break before they start rehearsing for the next panto – another version of 'Treasure Island'.

The Group considered becoming a Dramatic Society but found it would be too expensive to branch out alone. They are in partnership with the Village Hall and rely on ticket sales to cover expenses, and to date all productions have made significant profits to add to the Hall funds. The main backbone of the Group, around a dozen members, consists of a few regular cast, the set designer, scenery constructors, sound and lighting crew.

There is no membership fee and different people join the cast for most performances . The young children have a habit of growing up and either leave for other interests or graduate into bigger parts. They all love it and it gives them enormous confidence in themselves.
