Little Birch & Aconbury Joint Neighbourhood Development Plan

Little Birch Parish Council and Aconbury Parish Meeting have now approved the Draft Plan for Public Consultation.

The development plan has been prepared to deliver the vision for both parishes to 2031 and shows how both local natural and historic environments are protected. There will be a policy on the Rural Economy and the kind of businesses that will be supported. Policies about Community Facilities, Renewable Energy, Communications and Broadband are also included. It also shows the policies that will determine how each parish will meet the required housing targets up to 2031.

The questionnaire, which was completed and returned by well over 70% of all residents, earlier this year, was used as the blueprint for these policies. The public consultation process must be for at least 6 weeks and every household will receive a copy of the Draft Plan. A Comment Form will be included, giving opportunity to offer your views and thoughts on the proposed plan.

Little Birch Village Hall will host a 'Drop-in Event' to give everyone the chance to find out more. Look out for details on Notice Boards and announcements in both the 'Birches' Newsletter and the local 'Parish Mag'.

On 11 October David Nicholson, our consultant and the Steering Group are meeting at Little Birch Parish Hall at 7pm. to agree the format that the Public Consultation should take and to set the date at which it should start. Why not attend and be part of this important decision. Make a note now - all are very welcome.

Annual Horticultural Show Report for newsletter

The Annual Horticultural Show was held on Saturday 2nd September in LBVH. As the day dawned the sun shone and there was not a cloud in sight! A perfect day to display the many flowers, plants, vegetables and various other entries that were to appear through the Village Hall door between 9.00 am and 10.45am on Saturday morning.

There were 35 Entrants who proudly exhibited 281 entries between them, from a small Curly Wurly Chilli in the "Any Vegetable with an Interesting or Unusual Shape" category – won by Wendy Innes - to the Winner of the Best Exhibit in Show – a collection of 6 Vegetables – won by Des Wathen.

The array of flowers was a sight to behold – The Rose Bowl being won by Janet Gwinnett - with the Floral Art entitled a "Royal Anniversary" -certainly showing how flowers and foliage can be combined to perfection - also won by Janet Gwinnett.

Once again the Vegetable Class drew out the best in the entrants with 106 entries showing the largest marrow (which was huge!), a vast variety of Runner beans, Onions, Carrots, plus other vegetables and salad all displayed to perfection.

The Fruit Section proudly displayed a variety of excellent produce, from the juiciest Raspberries to the long and tantalizing Rhubarb!

The Horticultural Shield for both the classes was ably won by Derek Scrivens, who also walked away with the well deserved Llewellyn Sutton Cup for the person with the most points overall.

The Judge of the Domestic Class had a great time cutting and tasting the huge amount of entries from a Jar of Jam and a Jar of Chutney to a rather delicious deep apple pie; scones, sausage rolls, bread rolls to a Fruit cake made to a local recipe. The Cup was awarded to Kate Yeates for the most points overall in this section.

The Photographic Award, donated by the London Camera Exchange in Hereford and voted for by the public, was awarded to Janet Gwinnett, with the new Painting Class award being given to Helen Horne.

The new Handicraft Class produced some excellent entries with the Best Entry award going to Barbara Wilson for her Cushion.

Although the entries for the Children's Section were very low, pride of place went to Oscar John Roberts (4 yrs old) who ably walked away with the Children's Shield, a small cup, the Ann Thomas Trophy (Best Entry) and some money to spend!

At the end of the day raffle prizes were issued, and the Sale of Produce brought the day to a close.

A truly memorable event with the best displays one could only imagine. Some people went home with 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prize certificates, and a few Highly Commended certificates too. Even those who didn't win have the honour of knowing that they contributed to a good Show. Already they are planning how they can contribute to next years show!

MUCH BIRCH PCC APPEAL

Following the work undertaken to repair and refurbish the 4 windows on the south wall of St. Mary and St. Thomas a Becket Church in Much Birch, we are now in the process of contracting stonemasons to repair essential stonework surrounding those windows. Funds have been raised to cover the cost of both these works at £18,657.36.

THE PCC now needs to raise funds to undertake the essential repairs and refurbishment of the beautiful East Stained Glass window of the Church in order to preserve it, so we are setting up a general appeal to acquire the necessary £16,423.20 to undertake this work. So far we have raised £5,520.10 towards the cost through some kind donations, grants, and our own fundraising, but we are now appealing to the community to support us in any way they can to achieve the final sum required i.e. another £11,000.

The East window is an important treasure of the church and comprises of 9 roundels depicting scenes from the Mystery of the Rosary including The Crucifixion and the Last Supper. The whole window is fixed into surrounding stonework which is sited behind the Altar. Colours of the window are rich royal blues and reds in the borders, with tinted antique greens in the backgrounds and a mixture of antique colours in the roundels. We believe the window was installed in the 1850s when the Sanctuary was extended and no work has been carried out on it since then.
