Herefordshire Council created the 'Parish Initiative' whereby highway defects can be reported through the Parish Clerk directly to the Highways department. Every two months, representatives from the Highways department then visit Little Birch and inspect the reported defects to propose a plan of works. A number of potholes have successfully been filled, culverts and drains cleared quickly, either by Herefordshire Council or the lengthsman. L.B.P.C.

Report L.B. Parish Council A.M. and P.C.M. on Wednesday 5th May No interests were declared.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting held on 6th May 2009 and Parish Council Meeting held on 3rd March 2010 were read and signed as a true record.

Mr. J. Dillon was duly re-elected as chairman although he made it clear that he did not want to be nominated for the following year. Mr. J. Dillon gave a summary of the Council's activities for the past year beginning with thanks to the contribution made by the late Parish Councillor, Bill Powell, and welcoming his replacement, Annette Whistler. The Chairman remarked on the leading local issues discussed over the past year, including the closure of the Castle Inn, together with looking forward to future events of the possible creation of a Parish Plan with a Public Meeting organised for 10th June. He acknowledged the good work completed by the lengthsman and the Clerk and thanked Cllr. Richard Smith and CSO Fiona Witcher for their continued support.

Annual Financial Report - The Council's books were Parish available for inspection and the details Clerk issued of the 2009/2010 accounts. The balance available to the Parish Council for the 2010/2011 financial year is £768.48. The 2009/2010 figures were agreed by the Parish Council. Update on Village Hall - It was reported that the Village Hall has had a very good year financially with fund raising activities and grants received. Several projects to further refurbish the hall have been completed, including replacement fire doors, insulation, upgrading the gents' toilets and the kitchen. After the huge success of this year's pantomimes, further plans are to hold more, although this has not yet been agreed due to the sad death of Paul Bishop, one of the main contributors. The Chairman expressed special thanks to Mike & Jacky Morley and Robyn & Adrian Hodges for their invaluable dedication to keeping the Village Hall going.

Matters Arising

Village Hall – The refurbishment of the gents' toilets is complete. Outstanding issues include cavity wall insulation and tiling of the hallway. The Beetle Drive was deemed a success although more parishioners would have been welcomed. Another will be organised with more advertising for later in the year. The next Pub Night is planned for 22nd May and three other parties are already scheduled, including New Year's Eve.

Parish Lengthsman – An invoice has been received for maintenance work completed around Higgin's Well and Pendant Pitch. No further work is scheduled until the walkabout by the Parish Councillors is complete.

Parish Initiative – The latest spreadsheet is to be revised as part of the walkabout by the Parish Councillors.

Parish Plan – A public meeting has been organised for 10th June at 7:30pm at Little Birch Village Hall with Lynda Wilcox presenting.

Parish Field – Two quotes have been received for the clear out of the Parish Field. The Parish Council agreed to move forward with Mr. Usherwood's proposal.

The Castle Inn - Update on Herefordshire Council's visit to the Castle Inn re: Alleged Unauthorised Material Change of Use Correspondence received from Herefordshire Council informing that the Castle Inn was revisited on 22nd March with the outcome of an extension to 31st May. Further reference was also made to the alleged unauthorised signs displayed around the village with a threat of possible prosecution.

Planning Application

'The Crickets Croft', Little Dewchurch - retention of existing buildings and continued use to provide temporary annex accommodation including the construction of a glazed link – DMCE/100547/F – returned with no objections.

Any Other Business

The Chairman welcomed Annette Whistler to the Parish Council and thanked Elaine Godding for her candidacy and for her work with local issues.

A 'History Walk' is be organised around the 'old common'.

A request was made by Mr. M. Morley for the Parish Council to discuss the position of an Emergency Planning Co-ordinator during the next Parish Council Meeting.

A report was distributed by the Clerk, from Cllr. Richard Smith, summarising his and Hereford Council's achievements over the past year.

Neighbourhood Watch We Need Your Help

Can you keep a look out for the following car-derived van, which has been in the St Weonards/Orcop area, calling at premises offering 'left over tarmac'. The vehicle is a white Ford fiesta, NA 06 *JT. It is being driven by a white male in his late 50's with grey hair, sideburns and a moustache. He was wearing a fluorescent jacket and fluorescent trousers and had a slight 'gypsy' twang. He stated he was working at Orcop and had some tarmac left over, and would sell it at 'salvage' price. Trading Standards are after this individual, so any sightings, please let us know asap.

Crime update

Some good news to start with - here's another example of how the police and public can work together well in the fight against crime!

On Friday 7th May, a householder in Dinedor saw two males coming out of his neighbour's farm carrying a bike and a strimmer that they had just stolen from the property. He challenged them and managed to grab hold of one, while the other made off, leaving the stolen goods behind. The good neighbour managed to call 999, but then the lad he was holding onto also managed to get away. Still on the phone to police, the gent then gave chase on the bike that had been dropped by the thieves, and gave a running commentary as to where the lads were heading. He then stopped at the top of a hill from where he directed the police to where one of the lads was running, and the lad was duly arrested! The other lad is still at large but hopefully not for long. Well done to that good citizen!

There was another break-in to a parked vehicle on Thursday 6th between 11am and 8pm at the fishing lakes at Allensmore, this time nothing was stolen, but the vehicle was damaged by the suspect when he smashed a window and cracked the windscreen while breaking into the vehicle.

On Friday evening at about 7pm, a businessman on the Thorn Business Park at Rotherwas disturbed 3 males rummaging around items stored outside his factory. They made off in a silver Ford Mondeo V90*RJW - please be extra vigilant on the Rotherwas Industrial Estate as there have been a few incidents recently of undesirable characters hanging around.

On 23rd April a Yellow Porsche Carrera which had broken down on the A49 at Much Birch was stolen whilst the owner went for assistance. The vehicle was distinctive in that it had a blue roof.

A specialist tractor was stolen from a field in the Pontrilas area.

At about 08-35hrs on Saturday 26th April a road rage incident occurred near to JCB Gunn on the Straight Mile. The offender tried stopping a cyclist and punched out at the rider. The offender was described as male white, 6 foot tall, stocky muscular build, short skin head type hair cut. He was described as having a tribal type tattoo on his right arm above the elbow. He was driving a royal blue 4x4.

2009/10 saw Herefordshire Division record less than 10,000 crimes in the fiscal year. "This is a fantastic result," said Superintendent Kevin Purcell, who is in charge of the Division. And it's not just crime in general that Is dropping anti-social behaviour is too!" We are working closely with very Herefordshire Council and other local partner agencies to address anti-social behaviour (ASB). Because we now have reduced crime, we are able to

concentrate on other issues that matter to you. We aim to achieve a further reduction in this area and make the county an even better place to live and work."

Bogus businesses

We have been made aware that a company called **"CMC"** are calling older vulnerable people to arrange lifestyle assessments. Seemingly they have already taken £2,000 from someone for a walk in bath which they didn't need and has never arrived. **CMC's** telephone number is **01246 282878**. This has been looked into and OFCOM are investigating the number. Trading Standards are also aware so please be cautious when being offered such services.

Please also be advised that a security company calling themselves **EEC** Security Services have been telephoning numerous people in our area claiming they are 'in the area' next week and would like to call on individual addresses to discuss household security. EEC is known to several police forces for their hard selling techniques especially towards vulnerable elderly people. We Need Volunteers: So Get Involved Today!

Herefordshire Police are recruiting more volunteers for their Volunteer Scheme, which was started earlier this year. So why don't you come along and get involved today! There are many benefits for the Police to have volunteers involved in the wider Policing family. Volunteers help the Police in serving the wider community and are part of that same community so everyone is rewarded by the scheme.

Cop Cards

Finally, West Mercia Police have just launched 'Cop Cards' which is a brand new way of informing children about the work that police do in the force area, and are hoping that collecting the new cards will be a fun way for children to get to know their local officers and CSOs.

Cop Cards are a series of 25 playing card sized cards that carry pictures and descriptions of different policing roles throughout West Mercia. It is aimed at children aged 7 - 14 and the first 5 children in Herefordshire to collect them all and produce them at a police station will win a prize.

The cards can be collected from front counters at any police station or by asking local community support officers. The cards are a limited edition, so children will only be able to obtain single cards at random on request. Cop Cards are designed for children to swap amongst themselves, and once all 25 have been collected, the reverse side of the cards forms a map of the force area.

So let the children in your family know about the cards, as Andrew, Kevin and I will be carrying a supply round with us and will give them out on request!
