Report from the meeting of Much Birch Parish Council held on 2nd February 2012

During public participation time a parishioner asked if there had been any further developments regarding the bus stop opposite

King's Thorn Common. The Parish Council had no further information at this time. The Chairman asked the Clerk if she would contact HFDC Public Transport Section for an update.

Apologies were received from Cllr. Mike Smith who is unwell and from Ward Councillor Hamilton who had a prior engagement. A prejudicial interest was declared by Cllr. Sims on Planning item in respect of Whitacre, Wormelow.

The minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 2nd February 2012 were confirmed as a true record and signed by the Chairman. CSO Kate Middleton informed the Parish Council that she had nothing to add to the electronic briefing already sent out. She asked if there were any matters that the Parish Council knew of that the Police should be aware of. A query was raised about parking near the junction of The Thorn and C1263. CSO Hamilton will check with CSO Fiona Witcher to see if there is any further information.

The Clerk's written update on all action items to date was received. Cllr. Glen Sims gave an update on his meeting with the members of Little Birch Village Hall Committee involved with The Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations. Parish Councillors were given the minutes of the meeting. Cllr. Sims will build the Beacon and it will be registered by the Chairman of Little Birch Parish Council, Cllr. Mike Morley. Cllr. Sims will organise the collection of suitable materials for burning. Chairman Dave Davies volunteered to help Cllr. Sims.

The Financial report was noted and all payments listed were approved. Cllr. Alison Cook gave her report regarding internet and telephone banking. Cllr. Cook is to set up internet and telephone banking facilities on behalf of Much Birch Parish Council. The Parish Council are considering a request by Much Birch Parochial Church Council for a donation to help with maintenance of the Memorial Clock at Much Birch Church. The Clerk reported back to the Parish Council on the information given her by the Clerk in Worcestershire whose Council gives financial support for the Memorial Clock in its Parish Church. Councillors were reminded of the Risk Assessment given to them previously, and the Council's Donations Policy. It was decided that a review of the Donations Policy be carried out, and this should be an Agenda item for the

next Ordinary Meeting on 5th April. It was decided that a Working Group be formed to customise the revised Standing Orders issued by NALC for use by Much Birch Parish Council. Cllr. Stephen Turner and Chairman Dave Davies volunteered to be members of the group. Planning applications were considered at Whitacre, Wormelow, Herefordshire, HR2 8EJ for a rear two storey extension and at Chelston Grange, Much Birch, HR2 8HR to: Repollard 1 x Willow tree near gateway. Crown reduce 1 x American Oak to clear property at Chelston Grange. Both applications were supported by the Parish Council.

A copy of the suggested Policy document from HALC regarding dealing with Planning Applications between Parish Council Meetings had been received by each Parish Councillor. Initial discussion raised issues of timing during the processing of applications, and what would be regarded as a contentious. It was decided to raise this item on the Agenda of the next Parish Council Meeting.

With regards to Parish Roads and Footpaths: The following defects are to be reported to AMEY:- A 'ditch' has been created by a lorry going off the tarmac opposite The Kennels on the B4348. A large deep pothole on Ticklewithy Pitch. It was noted that the Lengthsman's Grant for 2011/12 is now fully spent. A parishioner has request some works to be added to the Lengthsman's Schedule and Cllr. Crum will visit the parishioner who is known to him, and make a list of her suggestions to bring back to the Parish Council.

It was noted that all of the Parish Footpaths have been walked and surveyed by Herefordshire Ramblers, and that electronic copies of those surveys have been sent to the Clerk. The Chairman expressed his thanks to The Ramblers. Prior to the meeting the Clerk had distributed information sheets on higher-end specification towed gritting machines. It was decided that before considering the possible purchase of such a machine, the Parish Council ask AMEY if the scheme is to continue over the next 5 years. It was also decided that a further meeting should take place between the Working Groups of both Parish Councils. It was decided that the Scheme be a 'rolling' Agenda item The date of the next meeting was confirmed as Thursday 5th April 2012 at 7.30p.m. at Much Birch Community Hall. **All** are most welcome.

A resolution was passed to exclude members of the press and public due to the confidential nature of the matters that were about to be discussed. The resignation of the Clerk was noted and accepted. The Clerk will continue in post until 31st March. The meeting was closed by the Chairman at 9.27p.m.

Please note that this is not the official record of the meeting. The minutes of a Parish Council meeting are the official record, and these only, once signed at the next meeting as a true record.

Report of the Little Birch Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday 7th March 2012

No interests were declared.

Minutes of the meeting held on 11th January 2012 were read and signed as a true record.

Matters Arising

Police Update – CSO. F. Witcher reported that Sgt. D. Boote was departing due to restructuring, leaving one Police Officer (PC Wendy Powell) and 3 CSOs for this Local Policing Area. No crimes for this area

although a news bulletin will be issued shortly reporting neighbouring area crime.

County Councillor's Update - Cllr. R. Hamilton was unable to attend.

Village Hall –The Pancake Evening was successful with various new activities planned including Quiz, Lent Lunch, Whist Evening etc. Details of the Newsletter staff were discussed.

Parish Lengthsman Scheme – After a walk around the Parish, a new list of works has been sent to the Lengthsman.

Winter Gritting – The towable spreader purchased by Much Birch Parish Council has been returned to the supplier as it was unfit for purpose.

Parish Initiative (PC-Iris) – After a walk around the Parish, further defects reported, a list of which has been emailed to each Parish Councillor.

Community Led Plan – Summary documents have been received from the Research Department at Herefordshire Council. The Steering Group is currently organising an evening in April to inform local residents of the results.

Neighbourhood Planning – A Neighbourhood Planning Meeting was attended and the Parish Council informed of its contents.

Parish Field – Tugwell Trees have cleared the ground but there are still protruding stumps and roots which could prove hazardous.

Parish Precept – Confirmation of the 2012/13 precept of £2700 has been received from Herefordshire Council. Estimate received from Herefordshire Council for 6 fingerposts to highlight the way to the Hill Fort, Clerk to write a letter to the original requester.

The Castle Inn – The pub has reopened with the existing owner after a short time with a temporary alternative landlord.

Methodist Chapel – Representatives of the trustees informed the Parish Council that they are not obliged to discuss the future of the building.

Queens Jubilee – A meeting was arranged on 15th February with an outcome of 2 days of events to take place with prior fund raising events organised. Training Courses – No training courses booked. Japanese Knotweed – Site visit with landowner arranged with former agreeing to spray the infected land in the Summer.

Holy Thorn Lane (Blackheart Lane) – Postponed for discussion to the next Parish Council Meeting. Clerk Vacancy – 3 potential candidates have contacted the Parish Council. Clerk to contact each one for potential Interviews week beginning 9th April.

HALC Southern Area Meeting – Mr. M. Morley informed the Parish Council of the contents after attending.

Planning-Planning Application for Castle Cottage, for the installation of ground mounted solar PV panels comprising 16 PV modules on ground bed of 54m2 area, S120303/FH, returned with no objections.

Planning Application for Highland Cottage for the Erection of Detached double garage – S120186/FH, comments made online and returned comments. Clerk to contact Herefordshire Council requesting information on why the last 2 planning applications were retrospective. After a late written request was received, correspondence to be written to a local resident concerning tree removal.

Local News

From time to time, it is good to report news and adventures of some of our young people in the community. It was recently learned that Rhys Atkinson of the Old Rectory is now studying Art and Graphic Design at university in London and that his older brother, Luke, is spending some months in Bangladesh, helping his girlfriend in her charity work helping poorer families there. Meanwhile, older sister, Melanie, opened a café in France near

one of the ski resorts and finds that it is rewarding but very hard work. We wish them all well in their various projects and it would be good to hear of other good news especially about young people's progress.

It is sad to record the death of Mrs. Audrey Williams, erstwhile of Much Birch, who will be remembered by many for her hard work and helpfulness to the community as Ward Councillor for over 20 years on the erstwhile South Herefordshire District Council.

Audrey was born at the Minster Farm in 1918, the daughter of Mr &Mrs. Harry Manning and was educated at the old Ross Grammar School. At the opening of the King's Thorn Memorial Hall in 1927 (erected in memory of those who served in the 1st. World War), she presented a bouquet of flowers to Mrs. Parrish, whose husband performed the ceremonial cutting of the ribbon.

Audrey married Thomas Gordon Williams of Tretire and they farmed there for some years. They then moved to the Ash Farm at the top of Tump Lane and animals figured prominently in their lives. There were ponies, horses, dogs and cats as family pets and the family of Dennis, Valerie and Jenny with Audrey and Gordon were all members of the South Hereford Hunt, based at Wormelow. They remained at Ash Farm until Gordon retired from farming and then lived at 2 addresses in Much Birch until Gordon died in the early 90's. Audrey and Gordon were very proud of their 10 grandchildren and to these have been added 10 great grandchildren and more recently, one great, great grandchild. Audrey subsequently moved to Grafton to be near Jenny and Bill Layton and continued her District Council work for several years.

She went into Charnwood retirement home some 2 years ago, then as she became more frail, she moved to the Oaklands Nursing Home in Hereford.

A Service to Celebrate her Life took place at Much Birch Church, which had played an important part in her life, on 28th February, conducted by Rev. Mark Johnson. A very typical photograph of Audrey was printed on the front of the Order of Service. Her body was laid to rest with that of Gordon in the churchyard. Donations were given in aid of the

Crime Trends

Between **2am** and **7:45am** on **THURSDAY 16-FEB-2012** Several small bales of hay were stolen from near a property in the Wormelow area, an unknown flatbed type vehicle was used to steal it. Incident number 112-S-160212 refers.

On **TUESDAY 21-FEB-2012** near Harewood End, several chainsaws and a quad bike were nearly taken. The offender(s) were disturbed and made off on foot to an unknown vehicle which was parked a short distance away from the area. Incident number 044-S-210212 refers.

About 650 litres of diesel was stolen from a tank on a farm in **St Weonards**. The theft was discovered on Tuesday 21st February and it is believed it happened the evening before. Incident no **412-s0-210212**

A quantity of scaffolding poles were stolen from outside a property in **Harewood End** overnight on Thursday 23rd/Friday 24th February. Incident number **102-s-240212**.

Warning - Jequirity bean bracelets important information has been circulated by the NHS We have received an alert regarding bracelets that have been on sale at Eden Project in Cornwall and another 36 retailers across the UK; urging customers to return the red and black bracelets made from the Jequirity bean, the deadly seed of the plant abrus precatorious. It contains the toxin abrin, a controlled substance under the Terrorism Act that if swallowed can kill in doses of just 3 micrograms. Abrin is chemically similar to ricin, a chemical warfare agent. People who have bought the bracelets are being urged to bag them and then wash their hands and avoid touching their eyes.

A male has been arrested and charged with several offences of burglary after extensive enquiries by officers and Scenes of Crime officers, three of these burglaries were reported in the briefing last year one in Vowchurch, one in Grafton and one in Allensmore.
