There were no major concerns with road users keeping to the speed limit.

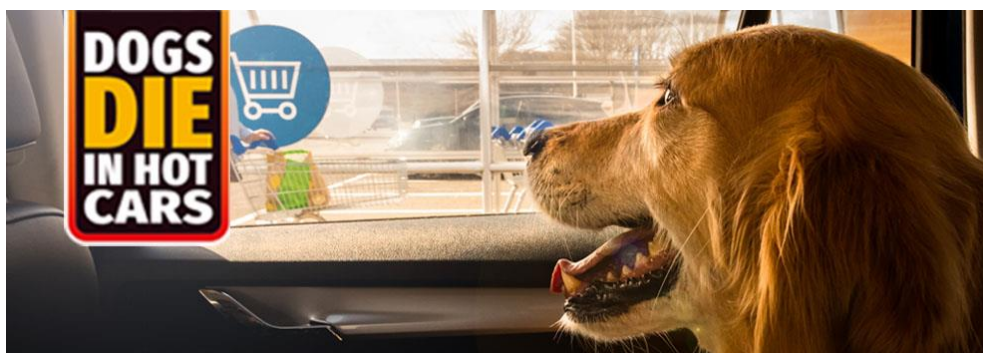


Dogs die in hot cars
