Op Forefront

Drugs warrants, teams targeting priority suspects, high visibility and plain clothes street patrols and road safety operations formed part of a day of action yesterday (Wednesday 28 February) across Herefordshire.

17 people were arrested across the county's Local Policing Area (LPA), including the warrants, and an intensive pre-planned operation focusing on people wanted for crimes including fraud, theft, assault, arson, domestic violence, and those wanted in court.

Officers from our Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNTs) also carried out patrols engaging with the community, as well as targeting shoplifters in Hereford, Ledbury, Leominster, Bromyard, and Kington.

Road policing units supported them with speed enforcement activities at known hotspots and our Problem-Solving Hub actively engaged with valued members of our farming and rural business communities as Herefordshire LPA spent the day in the spotlight.

There were five stop searches with four positive outcomes and 15 premises visited on the successful day of action which saw an estimated total of £5,000 worth of drugs seized, £14,400 of illegal property seized, 13 traffic tickets issued, and 15 suspects interviewed of which six investigations were started, six suspects were bailed for further enquiries and one suspect was sent to court.

Items seized included 766 packets of illegal cigarettes, 34 pouches of illegal hand rolling tobacco, 46 illegal vapes, two offensive weapons, nine mobile phones and seven bottles of alcohol spirits.

Officers from our teams also made 580 visits to community premises and signed up 165 people to our Neighbourhood Matters website to keep them informed of the latest policing matters where they live.

415 Neighbourhood Matters surveys were completed as well as school engagements and six community partnership events.

Officers across the LPA were joined by the force's chief officers, including T/Deputy Chief Constable Richard Cooper, who joined Task Force and CID on the warrants, where we caught and arrested one person and seized two offensive weapons at an address in Kingstone and seized some suspected class A drugs from an address in The Furlongs, Hereford.





Kingstone Arrest

At the start of February, arrests were made in Kingstone. 3 males were arrested for burglary dwelling and rural crime offences in the area of Kingstone. Multiple items recovered including suspected stolen goods.

We are trying to identify the owners of these items below, believed to be stolen following a burglary in Kingstone.

We had a good turn out from those attending the event, and a range of tools were property marked alongside our burglary prevention packs handed out, signage useful to farms and Neighbourhood Matters sign ups

The event was great to ease the concerns of residents and provide general security advice due to the recent incidents in the surrounding Kingstone area.

Community Speed Watch

This month, one of our new community speed watches (Much Birch CSW) received their training, joined by PCSO Marsh.

The members of the scheme have completed their training & are "on the road" to monitoring & recording in their area.

This scheme has been running for some years now & has great community benefits.

If this is something your community is interested in, here is the criteria needed:

 \otimes The area must have a 30mph or 40mph speed restriction.

 \otimes Speed data collected by West Mercia Police must show that speed levels in the area do not meet the national industry requirements for police enforcement.

 \otimes No other enforcement activity is currently in place.

 \otimes There must be at least six volunteers in each Community Speed Watch scheme.

 \otimes Speed checks must be conducted by at least three volunteers at any one time.
