Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting of Much Birch Parish Council held at Much Birch Community Hall on Thursday 8th March 2018

Open Session:-

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting.

PCSO Lowri Anderson and PCSO Adam Westlake were in attendance and they gave an update on local policing issues. There had been one recent crime in the area, a burglary at Kingsthorne where items had been taken and there had been a vehicle fire. It was advised that people had been going around trying to get into cars by trying the handles in Hereford. The issue of speeding in Tump Lane was noted and the Safer Roads Partnership had been data collecting. A new laser gun, to target speeding, had been supplied for police use.

The Open Session closed at 7.40pm.

There were apologies received from Cllr Andy Crum and Ward Cllr David Harlow.

3.0 Minutes of previous meeting

4.1) P.C.S.O. from West Mercia Police

The Bulletins with updates had been received and circulated. The PCSOs updated the meeting during the Open Session.

4.2) Ward Councillor Ward Cllr Harlow had sent his report as detailed here (sic):

"Ward member report, March 2018

Local matters

There have been few headline grabbing stories this month in Much Birch, aside from a few planning issues there has been very little to report. I'd imagine that road issues will come to the fore following this latest episode of bad weather with more pot holes etc

In the absence of other stories it's worth highlighting the work undertaken by Balfour Beatty to keep the county's roads moving; on a snowy winters night BBLP grit over 1000 miles of Herefordshire roads including 600 'priority routes' including the A49 and A466 in our area.

The county's salt bins also have to be fully stocked with just under 5,000 tonnes of salt available to the 30 strong gritting team operating 16 gritting trucks, 4 snow blowers and 2 quad bikes. It costs Herefordshire Council more than £30,000 a night to keep the roads clear at times like these – just some indication of where your council tax goes...

Whilst we're talking about roads I've attached an article at the end of this report that shows that Herefordshire is no worse than other counties when it comes to road maintenance. Tax payers up and down the country want better roads, we just have to work out how to pay for them!!!

Economic news

As many of you know I hold the Economic brief at the council and there have been various bits of good news to report. The Enterprise Zone in Rotherwas goes from strength to strength with Much Birch's Ken Davies in the final stages of building out his factory and R&D facilities as well as many other success stories (Shell store finances coming together, cyber centre developments)

More good news came with the planning committee granting planning permission to Model Farm in Ross which is a 15 hectare employment site which should be able to support 1000 jobs once built out. We hope to start work on the business park later this year."

Some routes had not been cleared and the Chair would check with the Locality Steward regarding clearance of Wrigglebrook area. It would also be checked regarding commissioning of additional snow clearance. There was a thank you recorded for everyone working together and co-operating during the recent bad weather conditions. It was always a concern that carers etc. would be able to access their clients when road conditions were prohibitive.
