The minutes of the meeting held on the 23rd January were read and signed as a true record.

Matters Arising

The Communications Committee will be finalised during the next Much Birch Parish Council meeting. A constitution is currently being written.

Village Hall - Replacement windows, front door mat and new curtains have been ordered. A grant has been received to fund an outside container.

Parish Lengthsman Scheme - No further work has been completed by the Lengthsman. Contractor to start work shortly to clear School Lane, Chapel Pitch and Crows Nest Lane culverts.

Central Heating Oil

By grouping together it is possible to pay less for our oil!

A co-ordinator gathers orders from people needing oil that month and contacts local companies for the best discounts. One dealer I spoke to said this was between 1/2 and 1% per litre, so on 1000 it could be up to £10.00. They are happy to do this because besides giving them a large order it

cuts down on their tanker journeys, allowing the driver to spend, say, a morning in one small area. The article I heard ordered 25,500 lts, for 27 drops.

If you are interested in the scheme or would consider co-ordinating it, contact me and we can see if it will be viable in our villages.

Neighbourhood Watch

Although the following are not in our immediate area, they are close enough to warrant a mention in the Newsletter.

Overnight 2nd/3rd March a Honda CRV parked outside a property in Dinedor was broken into, an Ipod and a wallet containing credit cards were stolen.

On 5th March in the afternoon, two males were disturbed by a householder breaking into a parked vehicle in Dinedor. The men made off in a white Peugeot 106 hatchback, with a yellow light on the top, M***YKF, we do have the full registration number, and enquiries to trace the vehicle are in hand. This vehicle was seen earlier by another resident of Dinedor, the male driver had knocked at her door asking if she was selling a van. She described him as late 20's, about 6' with dark hair. He had a tattoo on his arm, and she noticed a speech impediment, possibly a lisp.

Here also are the details of a van which was spotted acting suspiciously in the St Weonards/ Orcop area a couple of weeks ago.

A householder saw this vehicle, a light coloured Ford Transit V**KOA coming at speed along the road towards her property, it then swung into the driveway at the end of the garden where her partner's workshop was, and it pulled up alongside the doors. At this point the householder went out and challenged the driver, a male in his late 20's to early 30's with dark curly hair and an Irish accent. He said he was after old batteries, and was then sent on his way. There was a younger female in the passenger seat.

Exactly the same thing happened at this address before Christmas, but it was a different vehicle, although the caller was pretty sure it was the same man, he seemed to know exactly where to go.

A Belle cement mixer was stolen from a property under renovation in Kings Thorn in the past couple of weeks - also an attempt was made to force entry to a container where other tools are stored.

A few days ago, a householder in the Hentland area was approached by a team of tarmac layers offering to do some work on their drive, as they had some tarmac left over from another job - sound familiar?

The householder agreed for a small patch to be done, but within a few minutes the whole drive was being done, and a bill for over £4,000 was presented, which the householder refused to pay. The man has been very threatening, and has been constantly ringing the address. Police and Trading Standards are dealing with the incident. The householder is within his rights not to pay as he should have been given a 7 day cooling off period after receiving a quote before the work was done.

Obviously, we strongly recommend that you never agree to any work being carried out as a result of 'cold calling', but if you do, it's worth knowing about the 7 day cooling off period.

Finally, a vehicle parked in the Wormelow area had items stolen from it whilst the driver had temporarily left the vehicle unattended with the engine running last Saturday morning.
