

Lyonshall Castle

Next to the Church, Lyonshall castle today consists of some of the keep, a curtain wall

(which was 19 feet high) and extensions to the moat on the north side. Mentioned in Domesday as the property of Walter de Lacy. It was mostly constructed in stone in 1090 by the Devereux family, who were probably related to the Lacy family.



In 1391, Sir John Devereux contracted John Brown, a mason from Hereford, to build a hall and strengthen the gatehouse and in 1404, the castle was strengthened against Owain Glyndwr but it was a ruin by the end of the 15th. Century.

William Devereux was killed in the Battle of Lewes (1264) fighting for the De Montforts against the King. His lands were forfeited but the castle in 1390 was still in Devereux hands as it belonged to Sir John Devereux, Warden of the Cinque Ports and Constable of Dover. Later it passed to an attendant of King Henry V, Sir John Merlaury. Much of this information comes from Roger Pye who, together with Brian Lillistone, has written a useful little guide to St. Michael and All Angel's Church

Urishay Castle.

Up a steep hill near Peterchurch, Urishay consists today of a ruined manor, a not quite so ruined chapel and a small farm. The Manor was lived in until pre- World War 1 but was then demolished and the panelling went to Mull and some to the USA. The owners were the De la Hay family and the chapel still just survives in the care of the Friends of Friendless Churches but is in constant trouble with vandals.

The castle was originally a motte and bailey with the Manor built on top of the motte.

Tretire.

Fulk Fitzwarin had a motte and bailey castle here. Robinson describes it as a 'Large squarish mound on which several towers appear to have stood' but nowadays only a steep bank, a tennis court and a private house mark the site. The church nearby is part of the St. Weonards group and has a 14th. century coffin lid inside.

At 18, he was conscripted into the forces and wanted to follow his elder brother in the Parachute Regiment but to his disappointment this was not allowed. He did however serve in the Army and was involved with and taught the use of radar all over the UK. After demob, he again had several jobs but started as a driving instructor and in 1964 set up his own driving school, the Chislehurst School of Motoring. Having passed the RAC's Instructors Course. He also became a member of the Institute of Advanced Motorists soon after it was formed. He retired in 1987 and took up outdoor bowls.

Crime Trends

<u>Kilpeck</u>

A copper water tank was stolen from an unoccupied property outside the village between 5th - 21st February. The premises were insecure at the time.

Scams

A resident in the Golden Valley reported that she had received a call which she initially believed came from the police. The lady that called explained that the police, along with the Fire and Ambulance services, were holding a big exercise in the area and were looking at security, and that they were contacting people in the area to find out their needs. When the resident explained that she was a tenant rather than the owner of the property, the lady terminated the call. This is probably a company cold calling to sell alarms and leading the recipient to believe they are calling on behalf of the police, or even that they are the police. If you get such a call, it would be helpful if you could keep them on the line long enough to get a company name and contact details so we can investigate.

There are alarm companies that cold call, which, although annoying, don't break the law. However, if the salesperson is implying that the police are involved in any way, either by saying the police have recommended them, or that they are working with the police, then they are committing offences.

Another resident has forwarded us a copy of a very impressive looking letter from the 'International FIFA World Cup Online Lottery' with an address in Melbourne, Australia. The letter informed the recipient that he had won £900,000! A contact number was given for the lucky winner to call to arrange collection of his winnings. Needless to say, this is another scam.

Results

A white Ford transit van **BK*3EDO** was seized in **Didley** on Monday 2nd March by traffic officers for having no tax. The driver will have to pay a fine plus the removal fee before he can have his vehicle returned.

Fraud And Identity Theft (from our website)

Fraud and identity theft is one of the fastest growing areas of crime and occurs when your personal information is used by someone else without your knowledge.

While overall levels of crime remain low across Herefordshire, Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin and Worcestershire, the nature of modern technology and communications means that people can fall victim to criminals both here and in other parts of the world.

The National Fraud Authority estimates the loss to the UK economy from fraud is £73 billion per year. In the 2011/12 financial year, 2,715 fraud and forgery offences were recorded in the West Mercia policing area, a rise of seven per cent on the previous year. However, officers believe offences may be significantly under-reported.

Your identity and personal information are valuable to criminals. If they can find out your details, they can use your name to open bank accounts, get credit cards and loans or apply for state benefits and documents such as passports and driving licences. If your identity is stolen, you may have difficulty getting loans, credit cards or a mortgage until the matter is sorted out and you could also find yourself

What Information Are Criminals Interested In?

The key documents and information that criminals would like to get hold of are your:

- · Passport
- · Driving Licence
- · Bank account details cheque books, debits cards, receipts and statements
- · Credit card details cards, statements and receipts

Other information can also be useful to criminals, such as dates of birth, home addresses and even the names of your next of kin. Much of this information is routinely posted by people on the internet - either during transactions with retailers or through social networking sites. It pays to think carefully about what you want to disclose online.

Types of Fraud and Identity Theft

There are a variety of ways criminals can gain personal information about you to commit identity fraud. If you know what to look out for though, there is a much better chance of protecting yourself. Below are some of the more common ways that your identity can be compromised.

Online information

Information can be gained from transactions made online with disreputable retailers, by computer viruses which can intercept and send direct to the criminal information you type or simply by information you post on the internet. Many of us now use social networking sites like Facebook, MySpace or Bebo with large amounts of personal information available for others to see at the click of a button.

Bin raiding

Fraudsters are not averse to sifting through bins and rubbish to find personal information. Surveys have show that up to 79 per cent of household waste contained at least one piece of personal information that could be of use to criminals. This can include old utility statements, bank bills, insurance documents and even personal letters.

Intercepted mail

Sometimes fraudsters can intercept your mail and gain a wealth of personal information. This is more likely if you live in shared accommodation, have a communal letterbox or move house and do not get your mail forwarded to your new address.

Phishing

Phishing is the name given to the scam of sending emails at random that claim to be from a genuine company such as a bank or credit card company. These messages often claim it is necessary to "update" or "verify" your customer account information and they urge you to click on a link from the email that takes you to a bogus website. Information entered on the website (which can often appear to be a genuine site) such as a user name, password or memorable data, will be captured by the criminals for their own fraudulent purposes and could allow them to get access to your real account.

Unsolicited phone calls

Any phone calls you receive from banks asking you to update your personal information should be treated with caution. Call the switchboard of the company in question (you can often find the number on statements and documents you have been sent previously) and ask to be put through to the person that called you. Remember also that banks will never ask you to reveal your account pin number.

Courier Fraud

Courier fraud scams, are often targeted towards elderly and vulnerable people.

Typically the scammers will call landlines to pretend that they are from the police, and will state the victim's card has been used fraudulently. They will then ask their victims to call their bank to cancel their cards, but will in fact remain on the line in order to obtain bank details.

Once they have got these details, often including a PIN, they will then send a courier to collect the bank card, allowing them to then withdraw money from the victim's accounts.

Please remember police officers, and banks will never ask for account details or PINs over the phone. They also would not come around to your house to collect your cards or property.

We would encourage anyone with elderly relatives or friends to talk to them about this scam, and make sure that they are aware. If you receive a call like this, hang up immediately and call 101 using another phone. In an emergency or if a crime is in progress call 999.

Card skimming

This can occur when your credit card is cloned by copying your card information with a special device. This usually happens if you hand your card over to someone who takes it out of sight to make run through the transaction, so you should always be wary of such requests. Credit and debit card information can sometimes be copied when criminals tamper with ATM cashpoints, so do not use them if they appear in any way suspicious or tampered with.

Theft of wallet or purse

Your purse or wallet is likely to contain lots of valuable information, including credit and debit cards, driving licences and membership cards. If it is stolen, think carefully about what that information could be useful for and take appropriate action to alert the police, banks and other companies to the theft.

Find out more about protecting yourself against these crimes.

Remember: don't delay - take action straight away!

If you think you may have been the victim of a fraud, act quickly to make sure that you are not liable for financial losses caused by criminals using your identity:

· Report it to Action Fraud, the UK's national fraud reporting centre at www.actionfraud.police.uk.
Alternatively, you can contact Action Fraud by phone

on 0300 123 2040 (lines are open 8am-8p Monday to Friday and 9am to 5pm Saturday and Sunday.

- · Immediately report lost or stolen documents such as passports, driving licences, credit cards and cheque books to the organisations that issued them.
- · If an account has been fraudulently opened, contact the company concerned.
- \cdot Report suspicious transactions on statements to bank or credit card companies.
