## Neighbourhood Watch

## New Telephone Number

From Monday 3rd November 2008, West Mercia Constabulary's new non-emergency number is **0300 333 3000.** There are a number of reasons for this change. Research carried out on behalf of the force has indicated that the public would like a more memorable number for non-emergency calls to the police.

Rather than adopt a lower cost 0345 number which would still be similar to the old one, West Mercia adopted this more memorable number, which falls within a range protected by OFCOM for public sector use only. The new number offers a cheaper call rate to the old number and, having only two digits in the code, is easier and quicker to dial.

The change is to meet public demand and shows West Mercia Constabulary's responsive nature in line with our Citizen Focus agenda.

The existing 08457 444888 number will remain in place for at least 12 months to ensure that everyone is aware and to allow for forms and other literature to be amended as they are used up, thus avoiding waste. People living in the West Mercia area will be asked to update their telephone records and mobile and home phones with the new number to ensure they have the new number to hand when they need to make a non-emergency call to the police.

#### Crime Trends

A half ton sit-on road roller was stolen from St Weonards 30/09-01/10/08.

A cottage at Garway was broken into on 16/10/08.

A dwelling at Pencoyd was broken into on 16/10/08. It is believed the offenders left when the alarm activated.

A dwelling was broken into at Garway on 28/10/08. A silver vehicle had been seen in area at relevant time.

The telephone kiosk at Wormelow was attacked on 28/10/08. The suspects were seen in a blue Seat car W---JOG.

There have been 10 reports of persons having made off from petrol stations in the area within the last month. On several occasions, stolen number plates have been used. When using your cars please check the plates. If you find them missing, please report to the police immediately.

#### Lighten Up

Now that the darker nights are back with us, we are once again rolling out our Lighten Up home security campaign, designed to focus on staying safe during the winter months.

Readers will already be aware of the low levels of house burglary in Herefordshire - less than one a day across the county. However, we still need to be vigilant. It's easy for burglars to spot an empty house in the winter's evenings if there are no lights on.

Lighting is a good way to deter burglars. Not only do they not like being seen (external security lights), a house with one or more lights on inside normally means people are inside and their risk of getting caught increases greatly.

If you do go out for the evening, remember to leave a light on (not just in the hall though - no one lives in the hall!). Try using a low-energy light bulb, preferably attached to a timer switch. As part of the Lighten Up campaign, Npower have donated a large quantity of such bulbs to all our Local Policing Teams to give to householders free.

If you would like to try and a free low-energy light bulb, get in contact with your Local Policing Team to arrange collection.

#### Police Briefings

Since the last briefing there has been yet another drive off from Locks garage. This happened on Monday evening at 7.50pm, when two young males in a white Peugeot stole £45.00 of fuel. The vehicle was displaying plates which had been stolen from a vehicle parked in the car park of the Memorial Hall in Ewyas Harold the same evening.

There was a burglary yesterday afternoon between 3pm and 4.45pm at a house on Garway Hill. Cash and items of jewellery were taken.

There was a burglary in Llanwarne yesterday afternoon between 12.30 and 2pm. Items of jewellery were stolen along with electrical items from the house, and tools and a chainsaw were stolen from an outbuilding.

We had a couple of calls yesterday about three males in a blue Rover X\*\*SEJ in the Orcop and Bagwllydiart area, they were calling at properties asking occupiers if they wanted a conservatory, or new windows. The callers stated the males were rude and very unprofessional, they did have some literature with them, but details were not taken. A check was made later with the registered keeper of the vehicle, who claimed he was working for a company from Hereford called 'First Choice'.

Between 4th and 6th November, a pressure washer was stolen from inside some farm buildings at Grafton

Last Wednesday, 12<sup>th</sup> November, we had a rogue tarmac team on the patch again.

They called at a property in Allensmore where the occupier agreed to a small amount of work, there was a hole that needed filling in his drive. The next day while he was out, the tarmac team came and treated his whole drive. He refused to pay, and after an argument, the males left but said they would return for their money.

A similar incident involving the same team occurred in Howton, near Pontrilas, and again the occupier is in dispute and has refused to pay. The matter has been reported to Trading Standards.

The two males involved were using two vehicles - a white Vauxhall Combo van VF5\*ODR and a white Ford Transit van Y9\*\*MRO.

Please let us know if they have called on you or someone you know.

A very strange incident occurred on the road between Much Dewchurch and Kilpeck last Tuesda,y 11<sup>th</sup> November, evening at about 7.45pm. A male was overtaken whilst he was driving out of Much Dewchurch, and later saw the same vehicle on the Kilpeck Road pulled across the road, blocking his way. Thinking the car had had some sort of accident, he got out of his car to investigate. He was approached by two males from the car who demanded his phone, money and car keys which he refused. A fight ensued where the two would- be robbers came off worse, and they made off in the Kilpeck direction.

The males are described as aged 19 and 21-22, one was wearing a black hoody, light blue jeans and trainers, the other was wearing a dark waterproof coat, tracksuit bottoms and white trainers. One may have a jaw injury!

The only details of the car is that it was a 'B' registration, and either a Vauxhall Corsa or Honda Civic or similar, blue/black in colour.

If you can help with this one or have heard of a similar incident, please let us know.

We now have our supply of 'lighten up campaign' light bulbs as mentioned in our Newsletter, so if you'd like one, please let us know, they are free!

Finally, can I say that we really welcome any feedback or thoughts on our briefings - it is meant to be a two way process, and it's helpful to know if you feel they are useful, or maybe you are alarmed at reading about crime in your local area - let us know if we can improve them in any way or if there are other items we could be including.
