The parish council discussed a planning consultation application number 253502 for The Wriggle, Ladywell Lane, Kingsthorpe. This was for the demolition of an existing garage and the building of an extension to the side of the bungalow. The parish council resolved that there were no objections to the proposals, but a comment would be made concerning a recent permission for a building plot, next to the site, that did not appear to be included in the submitted drawing.

## Jobs for the garden in February

The first few days of January certainly gave us a taste of winter particularly the numerous days of bitter easterly winds that seem to go through you and not round. It was not difficult to stay indoors and thumb through the seed and plant catalogues that have arrived in the post and dream of luscious vegetables and arrays of beautiful flowers.

February is a good time to prune most roses.

Trim winter flowering heathers lightly after flowering.

Keep amaryllis growing - after flowers fade, cut the stem back to the base. Keep warm and watered adding some fertiliser every couple of weeks to feed the bulb.

Cut back herbaceous perennials to the ground.

Cut back autumn raspberry canes to the ground.

Add a general fertiliser to fruit trees, bushes and canes. Fork in lightly and mulch with manure or compost.

If you can keep them frost free, try planting some early potatoes (Rocket or Swift) in tubs or old buckets (with drain holes). They need to be at least 15 inches deep and at least 1 foot in diameter. Plant 3 tubers per container.

Chit seed potatoes ready for planting outside.

Sow broad beans in pots or root trainers and keep in a sheltered place or cold frame or greenhouse.

Plant shallots when the soil is suitable to work.

Complete hedge maintenance this month.

Delay disturbing bonfires and compost heaps until hibernating animals have left ( hedgehogs, grass snakes etc)

Continue feeding birds. If you haven't eaten all your stored fruit, any decayed fruit can be chopped up and put out for them.

## The Robots are coming!

Hi Everyone,

As if we didn't have enough to worry about, what with AI threatening to take over the world, there has been a lot of development of robots in the last few years, and they are starting to emerge onto the public stage with some impressive characteristics.

In recent months, you may have seen or heard about Optimus from Tesla (probably another over-hyped Musk project), Boston Dynamics showing off robots with great flexibility and, on the war front between Ukraine and Russia, robots acting both as guards and as transport for supplies into dangerous areas and wounded soldiers out.

Suddenly, what seemed like Sci-Fi to those of us who grew up in the 60s is coming into reality. And it is time to think about a couple of the questions that this throws up.

I remember reading Isaac Asimov's novels about robots and the three laws. Roots essentially as helpers to humankind and slaves that would put human life above their own and the challenges that this presented. But if we have robots on the front line – see above – who controls who they fire at and who they might kill? There is a UN Conference working on these things, but, as often is the case, ethics are trying to catch up with reality.

And a second thought – if we have robots in the home to do all the boring things like loading the dishwasher, folding and ironing clothes, dusting (and you may have a robot vacuum cleaner at home already), what does this do for our leisure time? Make us just doom-scroll more or get out and meet people more?

Robots will, I suspect, be both a blessing and a curse, it is up to us to work out how we use them for the benefit of all humanity and not create a two-tier society of those who have them and have so much leisure time and those who don't who are scrabbling to make ends meet because a lot of the menial jobs have now gone.

"Remainders of the Day" by Shaun Bythell.

## Use of the roadside grit bins

With the recent cold weather and icy conditions a reminder that when using the grit in the roadside bins it only needs to be spread thinly as it is moved on by vehicle tyres. For treating roads, paths, and driveways, the generally recommended amount is 10 to 30 grams of grit per square metre, this is roughly equivalent to a heaped tablespoon. Leaving it in big clumps uses the bin stock up quickly and doesn't give any more benefit. Also a reminder that the grit is for the road and not for use on private drives.


## From the Editor


