Crime Trends

Kingstone

Sometime overnight on Sunday 31st May/ Monday 1st June, a container at an industrial unit on the Dene Industrial Estate was broken into, however there was nothing inside to steal so the would be thieves left empty handed.

A brick and timber workshop at Webton Court was broken into between 8pm on Monday 1st June and 7am on Tuesday 2nd June. A padlock was forced off the doors and a quantity of power tools were stolen including two angle grinders, an electric drill, a set of ratchet spanners, a Stihl chainsaw and a Lawnflight strimmer.

Between 9am and 3.45pm on Tuesday 2nd June a detached garage used as a workshop at a property outside the village was broken into and a large quantity of tools connected to tree surgery work were stolen.

<u>Scams</u>

A reader has asked me to share the following details regarding an incident that happened to a friend in Hereford -

A friend of mine was robbed recently in town, it was obviously well planned — she had just put her bag in her car in Waitrose car park and she saw a man who seemed distressed — he said he wanted to get to the hospital and needed directions but wanted her to draw a map as his English wasn't good. He obviously had an accomplice as her bank cards were taken while she was busy giving him a map. I just thought people should be aware. They had obviously watched her using her card as they used her pin to withdraw fairly large amounts of money.

I would like to update you on a new initiative that your local Police, in Herefordshire, are undertaking. The initiative is the employment of a dedicated Watch Scheme Coordinator. This new post has been possible because of a ground breaking partnership with Ross on Wye NFU Mutual and has been funded by West Mercia Police, Police and Crime Commissioner's Rural Crime Fund. National Rural Crime Survey
