They moved into 'Chalice' in the 80's following the death of Miss Ivy Austen but Joan took up studies for a degree in the 'Humanities' through Keele University and graduated with a BA. in 1985, her graduation photograph of a smiling Joan was printed on the Order of Service for her funeral. However, Gordon also runs a florist's shop in Hay on Wye, and the floral tributes from the family show that he has inherited his father's artistry.

Joan passed her exams to become a 'Local Preacher' in the Hereford Methodist Circuit and took services at many of the chapels in the local area. She was a stalwart of the Methodist Chapel at the top of the Barrack Hill for many years. Keith and Mary Newman and Peter and Christine Dowsett were regular visitors to her home when she could no longer attend services.

Berenice and John worked for many years at Long Orchard Farm with Berenice picking soft fruit and apples in their season.

When the farm was sold John was made redundant and went to work for Bulmers. Meanwhile, Berenice, Ian and Kate worked for Frank Green at Everstone, mainly picking sprouts from August into the New Year.

John sadly died in March 2015 and Berenice was well supported by the family, including 5 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren. She had cancer a few years ago and had a brief spell in hospital recently. Her funeral took place at Hereford Crematorium on Mon. 6th. June and a photograph of Berenice on the Funeral Service Sheet showed a lovely, cheerful smile, which was her trademark.

The sudden death of Irene Hemmings at the age of 89 years occurred in late May. She was born in 1926 in Tottenham, North London and would have been 90 years of age in October. Her parents moved to Cheam in Surrey and it was there that Irene went to school. At 14, she started work as a cashier at Stone Cott CO-OP near Morden. WW2 started soon after but she was too young to enlist in the forces but when she turned 17, she joined the Women's Royal Air Force and was posted to Compton Bassett in Wiltshire. She was made clerk in charge of issuing passes out of camp, which probably made her very popular. She was transferred to Abbey House in London's Baker Street for a short while and then returned to Compton Bassett She met her husband to be, Arthur, at a local dance. Arthur was a sergeant in the RAF and was also a wireless operator and air gunner. They were married in September 1945 in Cheam. Of course, when discharged from the forces, people could go back to their old jobs or find something new. Irene went back to the CO-Op but Arthur took up an engineering course and trained as a mechanical engineer. He went to work for Babcock and Wilcox in London and so Irene and Arthur moved to Rayleigh in Essex.

In 1947, their only daughter, Christine, was born.

As Christine grew up, Irene went to work in the local post office and Arthur went to work for the Central Electricity Generating Board in Cardiff and then Stourbridge. It was then that the family moved to Stourbridge and Christine completed her education. Meanwhile in the early 1970's, the CEGB had been consolidating and Barnwood, Gloucester became the main office for Arthur. So another move was on the cards and Arthur and Irene found a plot in 1974 in Hollybush Lane, moved a static caravan on to the site, obtained planning permission and over the next 2 years, saw the foundations, walls of the house and roof built, while Arthur did a lot of the internal work, electrics plumbing etc and Irene acted as site foreman.


In 1976, the house was completed and the family moved in. Irene then went back to work for the Land Registry in Gloucester until her retirement in 1986. It was a few more years before Arthur retired and they

They also enjoyed travelling together and visited Hong Kong, Kenya and Gran Canaria and then in later years, Sidmouth and Falmouth and other resorts in the south west.

After 10 years of retirement, Arthur developed cancer and Irene tended to him at home right up to the last month of his life when he went into St. Michael's Hospice.

That was some 20 years ago, but Irene with help from family and friends kept herself busy and was involved with the British Legion Poppy Appeal, the WI, the Evergreen Club and distributed Parish Magazines

Her life was brightened up with the arrival of two great grandchildren, Adam and Luke, and although they lived some distance away in Durham, she would always wanted news and pictures of them.

Over the last year or so, Irene's eyesight began to deteriorate and she had to give up going out in the evenings and delivering magazines. Just a few weeks ago she had a meal with Christine and her husband at the Pilgrim Hotel, seemingly as bright as ever. But a couple of days later, a neighbour had to break in and found Irene unconscious and she was taken to the County Hospital and died there peacefully with her family around her.

Her funeral service took place on Wed. 8th. June at Much Birch Church and was conducted by Rev. Preb. Mark Johnson from whom these notes are gratefully acknowledged. She was laid to rest in the Churchyard with her late husband, Arthur, and will be sadly missed by Christine and her family and by a wide circle of friends, she was a lovely lady.



The Herefordian Piano Trio (Livi van Wormelo – Violin, Rachael Kennedy – Cello and Johannes Moore – piano) will play a prominent role in the programme performing sections of Piano Trios by Haydn, Max Bruch, Debussy and Frank Bridge. This will be interspersed by a selection of solo works including the 'Suite Populaire Espagnole' by Manuel de Falla for cello and piano, a selection of classic songs, and an organ solo by next year's Hereford Cathedral Organ Scholar, Laurence John. To add further colour and diversity to the programme there will be a guest performance by members of the Gilbert Consort of 16th Century music on period instruments including a virginal, recorder and crumhorns!



Many of the older generation do not and cannot comprehend why Facebook exists. I am trying to make friends outside Facebook while applying the same principles. Therefore, every day I walk down the street and tell each passer-by what I have eaten, how I feel at the moment, what I have done he night before, what I will do later and with whom. I give them pictures of my family, my dog and me gardening, taking things apart in the garage, watering the lawn, standing in front of landmarks, driving around town and doing what anybody and everybody does every day. I also listen to their conversations, give them the "thumbs up" and tell them that it works just like Facebook. I already have four people following me: two police officers, a private investigator and a psychiatrist.
