Sadly there have been four more deaths in the community this past few weeks.

Anne Hyde - Smith of Llanwarne passed away on 28th March and was well known in the area for Delivering Meals on Wheels for over 30 years. We send our sympathy to daughter, Laura and her family and to son, Richard.

Chris Savage of King's Thorn passed away the day after his 65th. birthday on April 10th.

Chris was born in Hackney, East London to Doris and Jim Savage and 5 years later Robin was born. Chris took his schooling quite seriously. As most young boys wanted, he acquired a small motorbike. He had a 'minor brush' with the police whilst on a provisional licence, but before the case came to court, Chris had passed both the motor cycle test and car driving test.

He took an apprenticeship as a car mechanic and in turn worked for Henlys and then moved on to fitting Coda car alarms. He was always interested in model car racing and built chassis's in the early years out of copper piping.

He went on to work for Radio Rentals and eventually for TV Rentals. At this time he met Judy, and sped up to Coventry at the weekends. He bought an old box shaped Ford Anglia, dropped the front suspension and fitted a

1500cc engine. Journey time from London to Coventry record must have been broken on several occasions but he was never caught for speeding!

He eventually married Judy and they had Leigh, Christopher and Holly together. Sadly, the marriage did not last.

When Chris moved into King's Thorn some 18 years ago, he was working for Advanced In Car Entertainment fitting DVD players and small TV's into cars. He was sent by the firm to new product launches in the USA and Far Eastern Countries and had to recommend new products worthy of possible exploitation.

He was interested in ornamental fish and installed a large aquarium in a unit he had built himself alongside the TV. He also constructed a large outdoor fish tank with a circulating pump and spray mast which was kept going all the year round to prevent freezing.

He met Ping some 12 years ago and after a whirlwind romance, they married in China.

Over the last 10 years he became a computer expert and was a very good neighbour to Betty and John Bryant. He joined ATS some 7 years ago as a tyre inspector and got on well with the various haulage firms and their staff.

Chris was never a gardener but built some raised beds for Ping to grow garlic, runner beans, strawberries and potatoes.

His interest in model car racing revived when he joined the

Hereford Club but later joined the Abergavenny Club and started to build to build his own track in his garage. This was completed about a year ago and several Club members were invited to use it from time to time.

He was very proud that Ping had passed the City and Guild exams in Hairdressing and that her son, Yong, had obtained his degree in Accountancy at Sheffield University.

Chris had been unwell for the last 3 months and eventually had to go to the County Hospital for tests. His brother, Robin, came to stay and ferried Ping to the hospital twice a day.

Chris came home on 31st March and Ping has given outstanding care and Dr. Seftel kept a close eye on Chris and the District Nurses based at Belmont gave their expert nursing care.

Chris was determined to make his 65th birthday on April 10th but despite a determined fight sadly died the following day. Ping received great support from Dr. Seftel and her friends Fiona from Kingstone and Li Jian from Wrigglebrook. The Palliative Care Nurse, Sue Horton, gave outstanding care and comfort on that day and Yan and Russell were of great comfort that evening when others had to leave with family commitments and before Yong arrived home from Manchester.

We extend to Ping and Yong and to Robin our deepest sympathies and they would like to acknowledge the many phone calls, Sympathy cards and gifts of flowers which have been overwhelming in their support at this very sad time.

A Service was held at Little Birch Church to Celebrate the Life of Margaret Mullins, known to most as 'Maggie', on May 8th conducted by Rev. Mark Johnson. Maggie died on April 17th, aged 85 years.

Maggie was born at Laburnam House, on, as she would as she would insist Laburnam Lane (aka as Parish Lane – she never liked that 'new' name!!)

An only child, the family soon moved to Castle Nibole at the beginning of the war. The house was always full to bursting with paying guests and evacuees from the South East, she would never know where she would sleep invariably it was up in the attics, but sometimes it would be in a 'proper' bedroom. She was initially educated at home, but soon moved to Little Birch School, before moving to the Redcap School and then finally Hereford High School where she gained her school certificate.

In 1955 she met and married Basil Mullins and they started their married life at Sunny Bank Farm, it was here that Sarah and Kate were born. In 1975 Sunny Bank was sold and the family moved to Crows Nest, this was her favourite home, she oversaw the extension and improvements, and created a beautiful garden, and it broke her heart to have to leave there when, in 1985 they had to move back to the

Little Birch & Aconbury's Joint Neighbourhood Development Plan

At the next meeting of the Steering Group, the Consultant Dr. David Nicholson, will be explaining the **Draft Neighbourhood Development Plan** he will have produced, following the discussion about David's 'Housing Delivery Report' at the last meeting in April.

The work is still currently under way by David and will show how the two parishes can meet Herefordshire Council's requirement for additional homes.

However the Draft Plan is much more than just how to meet housing targets. There will be many environmental issues such as the ones raised in the Questionnaires that were returned at the end of 2016. These reflect the kind of 'Neighbourhood' we would all like to see in the future. When completed, the **Draft Neighbourhood Development Plan** will be delivered to all households in Aconbury and Little Birch for consultation.

Anyone is welcome to attend these meetings and there is no long term committment to be part of the Steering Group, so if you wish to be part of the decision process, remember that the next meeting at Little Birch Village Hall is on Wednesday 26 July at 7pm. At that meeting the Steering Group will be discussing the Draft Plan, and those present will be able to suggest any amendments.

Again lots of improvement and a massive undertaking to bring the garden back to its' former glory. Her last move was in 1994 when she and Basil moved into the retirement bungalow Castle Fields. The accommodation may have been new, but again another garden to design and dig, a job she relished.

Dogs, working but mainly showing played a huge part in her life. She started showing in the mid sixties. She created a well known kennel under the affix of Athelwood (a shortened version of Athelstan Wood). She bred champions in Welsh Springers and Dachsunds, and latterly in Sussex Spaniels. Every weekend for years were spent showing the dogs country wide, she served on many committees, including the Three Counties, Hereford Canine Soc. and was, for many years Chairman of the Welsh Springer Spaniel Club, and she was always generous with advice and support to any potential new doggy owner. She was a popular judge, and judged at many shows including Crufts twice (the first to ever in Welsh Springers) the second time being the millennium Crufts in 2000, a real honour within the doggy world.

Maggie was a huge character, she simply loved people, she had a ready wit and relished in lively conversation always with a smile. She was so proud of staying in the village all her life, she measured her moves in fields - her last home just ½ a field from her first! Although she was diagnosed with dementia, she still lived at her home with the help of Kemble Care, Ruth Owen and Annette Hoyes, plus Kate who lived next door. She loved her garden, dogs and general gossip, she loved people and hugely enjoyed seeing any visitors that called by.

Sarah and Kate and families would like to thank everyone who attended Maggies' thanksgiving service, and for the many wonderful cards and messages received. She will be sadly missed by so many and we send our sincere condolences to daughters, Sarah and Kate, to son in laws, Alan and John and to grandchildren, Claire and Simon and James and Joanna.

There was standing room only for the funeral service of John Francis Roberts at the Forest of Dean Crematorium on 17th May. such was the regard in which he was held. Friends from the Much Birch Surgery and from the local community gathered to say 'Farewell' to a very popular friend and business man. John died at the age of 77 years and the Service was conducted by Rev. Mark Johnson. Ben Roberts gave the eulogy on behalf of the family and the following is a brief extract from his tribute.

John was born in Farnham, Surrey, on 30th. Sep. 1938 to Gladys and Frank Roberts. His father was called up for service in WW11 was captured and John did not see him again until he was 6 years old. On the day of his father's homecoming, John stood outside his Gran's house waving

a flag until he saw a soldier coming towards him with a kitbag over his shoulder. It was of course his father.

John left school at 15 and his first job was sewing 27inch wide strips of carpet into larger squares, for the princely sum of £2 per week. He then went to JS Furniture in Aldershot as a carpet estimator's assistant. His friend, Tony Crossly, set up the Reading Carpet Co. until he joined the RAF.

John always had an interest in aircraft and would cycle miles to Blackbush and Heathrow Airports with his friend Brian to see aircraft landing and taking off and noting their numbers. This was to stand him in good stead when he did his National Service in the RAF as a wireless operator.

He served overseas in Cyprus and Aden and visited Libya and Sudan.

John married his first wife, Pauline, in 1962 and they had 4 children together, Steven, Tim, James and Emma. He came to Hereford in 1964 to work at Eastern Carpet Stores and he eventually bought a house in Redhill for £3225.

John and Pauline's marriage ended but they remained friends and the 2 families regularly visited each other .

John met up with Lynette Teague in of all places Majorca when they were both on a Hereford United trip. They were

married in 1974 in Peterstow Church and went to live in Hereford.

They later bought 'Bellwood' in Little Birch now occupied by Mara and Dr. Davies, and in due time had 4 children, Ben, Lucy, Emily and Alice. Steven also lived at Bellwood and would make everyone a cup of tea to start the day. James, Tim and Emma would often stay in school holidays.

In 1985 the family moved to 'Lynwood' built by the late Tim Dillon, turning it into a lovely family home, transforming the garden and extending the house.

John established 'Wye Bridge Carpets' in Bridge Street, Hereford and ran it for 23 years, and became a well respected businessman, affectionately known simply as 'The Carpetman'. He was a governor of Much Birch School and a helper at 1st. Much Birch Cub Scouts. He also took part in several pantomimes, channelling his 'inner Frank Spencer' into various roles. He also served on the Village Hall committee at one stage. He was a founding member of the ' Compost Heap' and quietly fitted and gave the carpets at Little Birch Church. The family's had many wonderful holidays in France, John's favourite holiday spot.

Always a 'savvy' businessman and knew the economy was changing, he sold Wye Bridge Carpets in 1990 and started a new business, working from home and taking samples of carpet to peoples homes. There could only ever be one name for this new business, 'Carpetman' and with John Handley fitting the carpets and John doing the estimating, the business grew and became a success. Working from home enabled John to become head chef and as Lynette was working full time at Much Birch Surgery, the children remember John cooking delicious meals and wonderful bread. He would help get the children off to school in the mornings and pick them up in the evenings.

John retired in 2005 but always kept himself busy with a list of jobs to do left by Lynette. He has had several health issues over the years, suffering with 3 types of cancer and






