Local News.

Katie Powell, daughter of **Linda and Steve Turner**, is running in the London Marathon in aid of 'Mind', the mental health charity and we wish her every success in fund raising for this most worthy of charities.

A warm welcome is given to **Janet and Raymond Barrell** who have moved into Rectory Gardens, Tump Lane following their retirement from 40 years of farming at Grafton. They are well known to many in the area and we wish them many years of happiness in their new home.

It is sad to report the sudden death of **John Walker** at the age of 80. He was born at Dinedor to Harry and Ruth Walker who then moved to Little Birch when John was aged 1 year and brother, Bill came along a few years later. John attended Little Birch School for some 9 years but transferred to Much Birch for his last year of education. He did odd jobs for Capt. and Mrs Burdon at 'Hergest' in the school holidays and then did gardening for them when he left school. He joined the Territorial Army before being called up for National Service at the age of 18. John served with the KSLI in Germany and became the OC's driver, continuing in this role when his Unit returned to the UK. After demob, he worked at Johnson's garage at the bottom of the Callow for a few years and then drove delivery lorries for Davies Brook, the soft drink manufacturers. In 1961, John married Berenice Hancock, whose family lived at Upper House, just beyond the Methodist Chapel and just in Aconbury parish. They had 3 children, Roxanne, Ian and Kate who all attended Much Birch School.

John worked for the contractors who were building the M50 motorway and later joined the staff at Acheson's Long Orchard Farm where the main crops were strawberries, blackcurrants and apples as well as several houses of pigs. Later the pigs were replaced by chickens and the poultry muck was easier to spread in the blackcurrants. Berenice also worked at the farm during the picking seasons. When the farm was sold, John was made redundant and later joined Bulmers, checking in the cider apples during the autumn season. He stayed with Bulmers for 15 years until his retirement.

John and the family supported the Village Hall in many ways. John was often prominent in the annual pantomimes, he was 'caller' at the monthly bingo sessions and arranged and ran disco

dances.

Berenice and John later joined Ian and Julie when they ran the Castle Inn, where Ian was an excellent chef and Berenice and John created a very extensive and attractive garden. In due time, grandchildren came along and more recently Berenice and John became great grand parents. Later, they went on continental holidays with their friends in the village including trips to Switzerland, the World War battlefields and the Menin Gate in Belgium.

After spending all their working lives in Little Birch Parish, Berenice and John moved to a council bungalow in Little Dewchurch some 10 years ago but John has not enjoyed good health for several years. He spent several months in the Queen Elizabeth Hospital last year and again early this year. His death at home was sudden and an awful shock to Berenice and the family to whom, with brother, Bill, we send our sincere sympathies. Hereford Crematorium was full with family and many friends on Thursday, April 2nd. and the Service was conducted by retired priest, Rev. Brian Phillips from Ross. On the front of the Service sheet was a lovely and typical photograph of a smiling John. Donations in memory of John were given to Much Birch Surgery.

We were also sad to hear the sudden death of June nee Lloyd's husband, **Steve Holdsworth**. Steve was playing golf when he suddenly collapsed as reported in the Hereford Times. We send our sincere condolences to June and her family and also to Sue Jones and Diane Smith, June's sisters, and their families.

Many in the community will have known **Don Preece** who spent a big part of his life in Much Dewchurch. He died suddenly the day after celebrating 50 years as Verger at St. David's Church. He married Brenda in 1967 and together they kept the church spotlessly clean. Don's great love was singing and bell ringing and he locked and unlocked the church each day. One of his biggest projects was in re-hanging the bells from the original wooden one to a new steel frame. He did most of the work himself and also oversaw the re-roofing of the church. We offer our deepest sympathy to Brenda. Don will be very sadly missed by a great number of friends.

Many in the farming community will be sad to hear of the death of Ken Watkins of the Gillow Farm, St. Owen's Cross. He was 84 years of age and a stalwart committee member of the Llanwarne

Ploughing Society for many years. St. Weonards Church was full and overflowing with some 300 plus mourners, such was the high regard in which Ken was held. Our deepest sympathy is extended to his wife, Joan, and to son and daughter, Philip and Carolyn, and their families.
