

Seasonal Flu Clinics 2021

All patients over the age of 50 will be eligible for a flu vaccination this year, as well as those patients under 50 who have certain underlying health conditions. More information regarding the seasonal flu vaccine can be found at www.NHS.net

As you may have seen in the media, there has been a delay in the delivery of the Seasonal Flu Vaccinations to GP surgeries. Therefore our flu clinics that were due to commence in September have been slightly delayed. Our first clinic will now take place on **Saturday 2 October**. Those patients invited to this clinic will receive their invite letters during week ending 17 September.

Further clinics will take place on **Saturday 23 October** and in early November, following further deliveries of vaccines. Patients invited to these clinics will receive their invite letters by 10 October.

Please wait for your invite letter before attending. Please make sure you bring your letter with you on the day and arrive at the time slot advised on the letter.

Covid-19 Vaccination Boosters

At the time of writing, we are still awaiting guidance on when and how the covid-19 booster vaccinations will be administered. An announcement has been made that those at risk and those over 50 will be offered the booster. When we have more information we will update our website and facebook page.

Dispensary Collections

Please always allow at least 72 hours (3 working days) when ordering your repeat medication. During our current staff shortages it may take up to 5 working days to dispense. If possible please allow a little extra time when ordering.

Following feedback from patients, we have erected a shelter for patients to stand under when queuing at the dispensary collection point. We hope this will improve the patient experience when collecting medications during the winter months.





HISTORY WALK - Sunday 12 September - led by Alison Clarke

Our walk started in Parish Field where we heard about Little Birch Common, Enclosure Acts, squatters, driftways, carriageways, and much more. Stopping along the way we learnt of the ecclesiastical architect MrW Chick who designed Model Cottages, all about the old school, the old Wesleyan Chapel now Saddlebow View. Then into Athelstan's Wood to see evidence of charcoal burners.

Next, we walked on to Little Birch church. Here we heard how it was rebuilt (with a less draughty porch!) and its current ancient font was discovered in a local villager's garden with potatoes in it! Then on to Higgins Well, where Alison told an amusing story about what forced Higgins to build it. Finally, we learned why the Holy Thorn was considered holy and how Conan Doyle visited Castle Nibole. The walk was rounded off with a welcome cup of tea at the Village Hall.

Thank you Alison, for such a fascinating and enjoyable history tour of Little Birch.

Who owns the land?

It is an interesting question because it strikes at the very heart of our legal system. When the first settlers to this area, back in the Bronze Age some 5000 years ago, they were only at the start of agriculture. People mostly lived off the land hunting and gathering until the idea of planting and harvesting crops became important because then it was vital that you protected the land you had worked hard to clear.

Tribes have come and gone, families have risen and fallen, the Romans came and went! In mediaeval times, land started to become much more regulated – people started to have deeds that said they had "rights" to certain bits of land and, of course, the majority of us didn't have much but worked a feudal system.

Since then, of course, things have moved on again, we have maps and land registry services and all of that to sort out where the boundaries of your house and garden start and finish. May be you will pass on your home to your children (or maybe it will be sold to pay for your care in old age!).

In the Old Testament, the land belonged to God and humanity were stewards of it – a very different understanding of ownership. It meant that the land was left fallow every seventh year but also, if you fell on hard times, you could "sell" your land to your neighbour but it would be restored to you every 7^{th} year – that way you always had the hope that you could start again. For an agrarian community, it was a way to make sure that no farmer got too big! Not sure that would go down so well these days.

However, as Christians, we believe that we are stewards of God's creation, both the land and all that lives on it. We have a duty of care to the land – it is "holy" perhaps we might use the word "sacred" – so that all creation might flourish. As climate heating threatens the very land we live on and the land we are called to protect, a chance in the way we live in vital.
