three weeks had been posted to France. He was killed in action just before Christmas 1914. His body and those of four fellow soldiers were found in a ditch some 43 years later and reburied in the London Military Cemetery in France.

After an early morning start and a long trip, Mr. Frederick Pearson, Drum Major of the Epping Forest Pipe Band, laid a wreath to the memory of Violette Szabo GC and former serviceman, Mr Trevor Forrester laid a wreath on behalf of the Pilgrim Hotel.

Veteran of the Normandy landings in World War 2, Mr Peter Davies gave the 'Remembrance exhortation' and told the pupils of his hopes that they would never know war but would live always in peace.

The ceremony concluded when Miss Rigby gave each child a bookmark from the museum and Trevor Forrester handed out hot chocolate and homemade biscuits from the kitchens of the Pilgrim Hotel.

### **History Group**

1. Rhys Griffiths from the Resources and Archive Centre, Rotherwas, gave an excellent well-attended talk on **Maps of Hereford-shire** at Little Birch Village Hall on October 13<sup>th</sup>. He explained how maps were produced from the earliest times for military and other purposes, about the old maps in the centre and their conservation.

Included in the talk was a description of the method used to prepare a remarkably accurate and one of the oldest maps of the city of Hereford. It was done by taking sightings from the cathedral tower and measuring distances by paces. Remarkably the working document used to make the map, including sketches of churches, city gates and the Wye bridge still exists (though not in Hereford).

Anyone is welcome to visit the centre to view and study the maps, many of which can also be viewed on the Internet.

(The centre also stages exhibitions that are changed regularly.)

- Light the firework at arm's length with a taper and stand well back.
- Keep naked flames, including cigarettes, away from fireworks.

- Don't put fireworks in pockets and never throw them.
- Direct any rocket fireworks well away from spectators.
- Never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire.
- Make sure that the fire is out and surroundings are made safe before leaving.
